# **Advocacy Update MPH**

### Oral Health Day at the Capitol 2023

For the second year in a row, the Arizona Dental Hygienists' Association (AzDHA) teamed up with the Children's Action Alliance (CAA) and the **Arizona Oral Health Coalition** (AZOHC) to host Oral Health Day at the Capitol 2023 on Wednesday, March 8th. Dental hygiene was well represented comprising most of the attendees. It was a real treat to have Mohave Community College dental hygiene students, accompanied by their faculty, Dani Walker and Tracy Gift, in attendance! In total, there were 49 attendees participating in 37 meetings with legislators or staff. We focused on garnering support for the preventive dental care for adult members of AHCCCS bill (HB2338) and of course, the AzDHA-backed scope of practice bill (HB2473). And it was a good day for both bills!!

### **AzDHA Legislative Priorities**

It's been a good news/bad news month for us. Fortunately, more good news than bad. Here's where we currently stand on our priority bills:

HB 2338 AHCCCS; preventive dental care (Rep. Amish Shah - D) - We had a big win last week with the bill that establishes a preventative dental benefit for adult members of AHCCCS. On our Oral Health Day at the Capitol, March 8th, this bill was third read and successfully passed out of the House and transmitted to the Senate. We eagerly await action in the Senate!

HB 2473 dental hygienists; scope of practice (Rep. Steve Montenegro - R) - Our dental hygiene scope of practice bill (expanding our scope to include dental hygiene assessment and dental hygiene treatment planning) is moving along nicely. Having no real problems in the House, it has already passed through both the Senate Health & Human Services and Rules Committees. We now wait for floor action. If it passes (and we expect it will), it will go the governor for signature.

### SB 1248 and HB 2529 scope of practice; process;

**repeal** (Sen. T.J. Shope – R & Rep. Steve Montenegro – R, respectively) – These mirror bills repeal the requirement that state-regulated health professions, like dental hygiene, go through the statutory sunrise review process for proposed scope of practice expansions. The Senate version (1248) was successfully swapped for the house version, was third read and transmitted to the governor for signature. Unfortunately, we experienced a major disappointment as Governor Hobbs elected to **veto** the bill. Her letter explaining her veto can be found <u>HERE</u>. This is a prime example of the perils we face during the legislative process!

HB 2036 dental board; rules; assistance; repeal (Rep. Selina Bliss - R) - This bill repeals statute that requires the Arizona

State Board of Dental Examiners (Board) to adopt rules that provide a method for them to receive assistance and advice on matters relating to the regulation of dental hygienists, denturists and business entities providing dental services. We opposed this bill and have successfully halted its progress. It was never heard in House Health & Human Services Committee by the deadline and because of that, it is effectively dead. In light of this, we look forward to working with the Board of Dental Examiners to find a useful and streamlined way for dental hygienists to participate in the regulation of their profession.

### Topic:

The Battle to Breathe: Myofuntional Therapy, Sleep Disordered Breathing, and the Role of Dentistry

### Course description:

OMD (orofacial myofunctional disorders) affect roughly 38% of the general population. Without intervention, OMD can lead to abnormal facial growth, speech problems, orthodontic concerns, and sleep-disordered breathing. Untreated obstructive sleep apnea puts a patient at risk for a multitude of health problems including heart disease, stroke, diabetes, digestive problems, mental health concerns, cancer, and Alzheimer's. As dental professionals, we play an essential role in the identification of OMD, breathing, and sleep disorders for our patients.

### **Objectives:**

Learn the signs and symptoms of OMD through the lifespan. Identify patients who are at risk for sleep-disordered breathing using the Fairest 6 screening tool.
