Our quest for clarity on how existing statutes & rules apply to the administration of Botox & dermal fillers is now in the hands of the AZ Attorney General!

As a reminder, AzDHA has been seeking a definitive answer to the question, "Does current law [A.R.S. § 32-1281(C)] & rule [R4-11-601(B)] already allow dental hygienists to administer Botox® and dermal fillers under certain conditions?"

We requested an answer at the Dec. 2nd BODEX meeting and expected the issue to be continued at its January meeting. When it did not appear on the January agenda, we sought clarification from Executive Director Ryan Edmonson as to what the next steps would be. Mr. Edmonson advised us that the Board chose not to offer an opinion on Dec. 2nd because it was outside their legal duty. Further we were advised that "A legal opinion should be sought from the Attorney General's office, who is really the only one to provide an interpretation of the statutes." Since BODEX was NOT going to do that, we made it happen.


Children's Dental Health Month

During Children's Dental Health Month, it is a good time to reflect on our knowledge and approach with children and young families. As oral health preventive specialists we are well versed with providing information on the caries process, nutritional counseling, home care instruction to our families with children starting at age one. But are we taking the time to share and educate our pregnant or first-time moms with new babies? If not, I think it is a valuable opportunity to up our professional game.

As a dental hygienist with Dignity Health's First Teeth First Program, I work with babies, toddlers, preschool children and expectant mothers. Oral screenings, fluoride varnish treatments, oral health education, appointment setting, and care coordination are the free services provided to children, birth to age 5 and pregnant women. The program currently works in partnership with pediatrician's offices practicing medical dental integration and at childcare facilities within Maricopa County. Funding comes from Arizona's tobacco tax and goes to First Things First (FTF) early childhood agency, committed to the healthy development and learning of young children from birth to age 5.
